There are many resources online that can help make the library fun for students. Check out a few we've highlighted here...

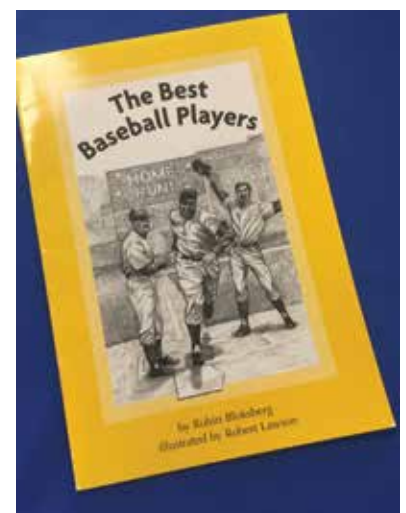
